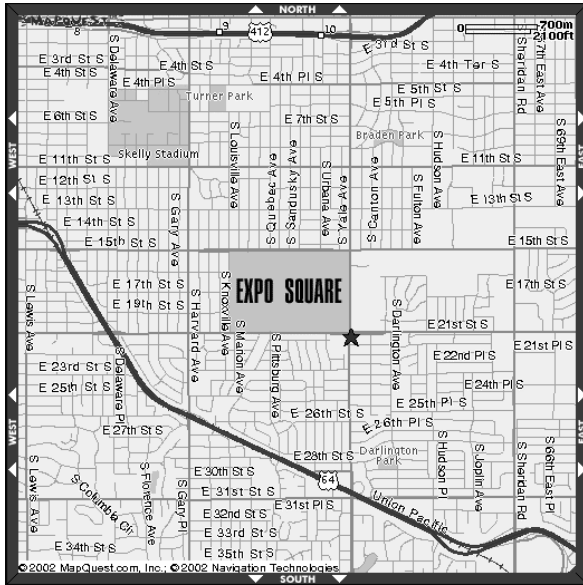

## GENERAL RULES FOR PUREBRED AND HALF-ARABIAN SHOW

Refer to the front of the Tulsa State Fair  
book for their General Information.

This horse show is conducted in accordance with the Rules of the United States Equestrian Federation, Arabian Horse Division. The official Rule Book of United States Equestrian Federation will prevail for this show.

This premium list is based on the rules of the current Rule Book. Any changes or corrections of rules will automatically become a part of this premium list. Each participant in the show is responsible for knowledge of and is subject to the United States Equestrian Federation Rules. The Show Committee shall decide questions not covered by United States Equestrian Federation rules and its decisions will be final.

This show is co-sponsored by the Tulsa State Fair and the Green Country Arabian Horse Association and is conducted under the rules of the USEF Association. The Tulsa State Fair is classified by the USEF as a Class "A" Show in the Arabian, Half-Arabian, Anglo Arabian Division and a Class "C" in the Jr. Exhibitor Arabian, Half-Arabian, Anglo Arabian Division.

1. **ENTRY DEADLINE:** Entries must be postmarked by 08/27/10
2. **ENTRY EXTENSION:** Entries that were not postmarked by 08/27/10 can enter until 09/10/10 with a \$30.00 per horse entry extension fee.
3. **LATE ENTRIES:** Entries postmarked after 09/10/10 or additional animals added to entries previously received, may do so until 09/24/10 at \$60.00 per head in addition to regular head and class fees if stalls are available.
4. **POST ENTRIES:** For horses already entered in the show, post entries will be accepted if made at least one hour prior to the beginning of the session in which the class is to be held. There will be a \$5.00 per class post entry charge.
5. **WITHDRAWING ENTRIES:** Entries may be scratched from the show PRIOR TO 08/27/10 for a refund minus the office fee. After that date, withdrawals accompanied by a veterinarian's certificate of inability to show will receive refunds of class entry fees only.
6. **SUBSTITUTIONS:** Substitutions of animals will be accepted until noon the day preceding the show for \$15.00. Change in ownership is not a substitution.

THE FOLLOWING MUST BE MAILED TO THE SHOW SECRETARY:

- A.) The complete, signed entry form.
- B.) Fees payable to GCAHA.
- C.) Photocopies required to be sent with entries:
  - Horse's Registration Certification: both sides.
  - Proof of Ownership (if applicable): In the case of a sale or lease, it is required that a copy of the sale contract or lease, or statement from the owner be submitted with the copy of the current registration certificate.
  - USEF Membership cards (owner, trainer, rider, driver & handler)
  - AHA Membership cards (owner, trainer, rider, driver & handler)
  - USEF Amateur Certification (if applicable)

Copies of your actual current AHA/USEF membership cards are required or single event fees will be charged. AHA affidavits are no longer available. If you do not have proof of current AHA membership you must pay the AHA single event member fee. Exhibitors showing in Amateur Owner classes must be listed as an owner of the horse they are exhibition.

**USEF RULE CHANGE:** No Affidavits. You will have to pay \$30 non-member fee. Starting December 1, 2008, there will no longer be an affidavit for payment of non-member fees. GR1309.2.b states, "If an exhibitor does not submit the proper membership documentation to the competition and the competition cannot verify such information the exhibitor will be responsible to pay a \$30 non-member fee which is non-refundable."

7. **CALL FOR CLASSES:** Classes will be called promptly. Two minutes will be allowed after the first horse in the class enters the ring, after which time the gate will be closed. **\*\*NOTE\*\*** Due to unforeseeable problems with the mechanical device, the paddock and barn calls over the PA system must be considered a COURTESY. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be sure that his/her horse is at the gate at the prescribed time. While every effort will be made to maintain a working PA system to carry the class calls, no protest will be upheld nor will any section be changed on the basis of a PA malfunction.
8. The Tulsa State Fair will not accept any entry unless the required fees and photocopies of registration papers accompany it. Omission of requested information, incorrect information, or insufficient checks will result in the entry being disqualified. **ABSOLUTELY NO ENTRY WILL BE ACCEPTED UNLESS THE APPROPRIATE SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER IS SHOWN ON THE ENTRY BLANK.** Please mail your entry to: Velma Boodt, Tulsa Fair Arabian Horse Division, 53708 W. 231st St. South, Depew, OK 74028
9. **EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH. FUTURITY CLASSES ARE RUN IN ACCORDANCE WITH USEF RULES.**
10. **JUNIOR CLASSES:** Riders shall not have reached their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday. The age of a rider on December 1<sup>st</sup> shall be maintained for the entire show year.
11. **DRESS:** All riders and drivers shall be appropriately dressed. Refer to USEF Rulebook.
12. **BEDDING:** Exhibitor to furnish own. Feed and bedding may be purchased in the designated area in the Explorer Barn (Barn C).
13. **AHA REQUIREMENTS:**
  - A.) All exhibitors entered in this event must be a current AHA member, join AHA at the show, or pay a Single Event Membership fee of \$35.00 per person. This includes any owner, trainer, driver, rider, or halter handler who exhibits horses in the show ring or signs the entry form as the responsible person for any individual's horse. A photocopy of your AHA membership card must accompany your entry.
  - B.) AHA Membership Affidavit is no longer available. If you do not have your AHA card you must pay the single event Member fee.
  - C.) There is a mandatory \$3.00 per horse fee for AHA judges' commission and education/evaluation, Resolution 9-90. RESOLUTION 9-90.
  - D.) Walk-trot and leadline riders are exempt from AHA non-member fees.

14. **USEF REQUIREMENTS:**

- A.) A non-member of USEF who wishes to participate as a rider, driver, handler, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at this show must pay a non-member registration fee of \$30.
- B.) A non-member showing in any amateur class must pay an amateur certification fee of \$30.00 if they have not already done that during the current year at a previous show.
- C.) Amateurs: All adult riders/drivers/handlers in "Amateur" classes (including futurity classes) **MUST HAVE** in their possession an Amateur certification Membership card issued by USEF or make application for such card prior with the Show Secretary at least one hour prior to showing in any Amateur Class. If you are not a member of USEF and do not have an Amateur Certification card you can:
  - Pay a \$30 non-member fee and a \$30 Amateur Certification fee
  - Or become a USEF Senior member. Senior membership is \$55 which includes Amateur Certification.
- D.) There is a mandatory USEF fee of \$15.00 per horse (\$7 Drugs and Medication & \$8 USEF).
- E.) A photocopy of your USEF membership card must accompany your entry.
- F.) Walk-trot and leadline riders are exempt from USEF non-member fees.

15. **USEF RULEBOOK AR101 ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE:** **Purebred:** Horses shown in this division must have been issued a certificate of registration from the Arabian Horse Registry of America, Inc., or the Arabian Horse Association as a Purebred Arabian and/or the Canadian Arabian Horse Registry (or in the case of a foreign entry, which has not been issued said certificate of registration, have been issued a Competition Visa by the Arabian Horse Association), or, **if under one year of age, be eligible for registry, and registration applied for** (Exception: AR249.1) **and must be entered under their full registered name.** (Only weanlings that have had registration applied for may show without registration papers). A copy of the registration papers showing the owner of record with the Arabian Horse Association must be submitted with entry form at the time of making entry; competition management is responsible for notifying exhibitors of this requirement. A copy of the registration papers will be returned when exhibitors pick up their numbers. In the case of a sale or lease, it is required that a contract of the sale or lease, or statement from owner be submitted with the copy of the registration papers. (Exception: Horses under one year of age.

**Half-Arabians and Anglo-Arabians:** Horses shown in this section must have been issued a certificate of registration from the International Arabian Horse Association or the Arabian Horse Association or the Canadian Partbred Arabian Register as a Half-Arabian or Anglo-Arabian, **or if under one year of age, be eligible for registry and registration applied for and must be entered under their full registered name.**

16. **STEWARDS:** May inspect at any time.

17. **TRAILER PARKING:** All livestock trailers must be parked in the off-site lot designation for trailers. No trailers will be allowed to park on the grounds. **EXHIBITORS MUST HAVE A RELEASE FROM THE BREED SUPERINTENDENT TO RETRIEVE LIVESTOCK TRAILERS FROM THE TRAILER PARKING AREA.**

18. **FUTURITY CLASSES:** Owners will be responsible for entering their nominees in their respective Futurity Classes at NO CHARGE for Futurity classes. ANY HORSE PARTICIPATING IN A FUTURITY MUST ALSO ENTER AND SHOW IN A COMPARABLE REGULAR CLASS TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR FUTURITY WINNINGS. Weanlings must be eligible for registry, and registration applied for and must be entered under their full registered name. See USEF Rulebook AR101 for more information. Handlers must have a USEF Amateur certification to show in the ATH Futurity classes. Futurity classes will be governed under USEF rules. Monies will be divided according to the Futurity Rules, and the Stallion Service Arabian Futurity Rules. Futurity Chairperson: Beverly Cargile, 14631 N. 75<sup>th</sup> E. Avenue, Collinsville, OK 74021, 918-371-5285. Prize monies will be mailed to exhibitors, unless otherwise announced during the show.
19. **SELECT RIDER CLASSES:** Refer to USEF rulebook AR 113 for definition of select rider.
20. **WALK-TROT CLASSES:** Open to riders 10 years old and under. Refer to United States Equestrian Federation Rule AR27. Riders are not allowed to cross-enter any other classes except Breeding/In-Hand, Showmanship, or other Walk-Trot classes.
21. **EQUITATION:** All equitation classes shall be governed in accordance with USEF rules as modified by the AHA Equitation rules in the current AHA handbook.  
**AHA MEDAL CLASSES:** If a class does not fill, that is if the class does not have at least **THREE** competitors with proper appointments, the class will be held as a regular equitation class with pattern. No medal will be awarded if the class is conducted as a regular Equitation Class. Medal Classes will be conducted as set forth in AHA Article 1117.
22. **LEADLINE:** Refer to United States Equestrian Federation Rule AR28.
23. **CANCELLATION OF CLASSES DUE TO EMERGENCIES:** In the event that a class, or a series of classes, or all or part of the competition is cancelled due to an accident, storm, or other emergency after the start of the show (defined as initial Move-In Day), no refund of entry fees will be made.
24. **JUDGES:** This show will be judged according to the single judge system. In the event that an official is unable to perform his duties, the Show Committee reserves the right to substitute an official according to USEF rules. It is a violation of USEF Rules to commit any act or make remarks during the show that are considered offensive or made with intent to influence or cast aspersions on the judging and any exhibitor may be barred from the show for this offense by the Show Committee. No contact shall be made with the Judges during the period of the show unless accompanied by a member of the Show Committee designated by the committee for such purpose. Further, no exhibitor shall approach a Judge regarding a decision unless he first obtains permissions from the Steward, who shall arrange an appointment with the Judge at a proper time and place.
25. **ARENAS:** Ford Truck Arena is 150' x 225'. Mustang Arena is 240' x 135'. Warm-up arena is 100' by 200'. All arena footing is sandy loam and clay.
26. **PRIZE LIST CHANGES AND/OR CORRECTIONS:** Changes and/or corrections to the Premium, if any, will be posted on the Club's website, [www.gcaha.org](http://www.gcaha.org) or [www.tulsastatefair.com](http://www.tulsastatefair.com)
27. **MEDICAL WASTES:** Sharps containers are available at least one per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other sharp medical waste.
28. **STALLS AND BEDDING:** Stalls are 10 X 10 and are on asphalt floors with a door. Stalls and alleyways must be kept clean. Stalls will be locked until you arrive. Contact Jeff Wright at 918-557-1254 to get stalls unlocked or go to the show office.

29. **SHOW ACCOUNTS:** Any exhibitor wishing to start a tab at the Show Office will be required to leave a signed check when they pick up their packet.
30. **EXHIBITOR PASSES:** Are included with entry fees. 1 entry = 1 pass, 2-4 entries = 2 passes, 5 or more entries = 3 passes. Additional tickets available for purchase if needed. Exhibitors must enter through Gate 7 and will pick up exhibitor passes at the credentials trailer at Gate 7. Once the fair begins, you must have an exhibitor pass or pay a one day admission fee to get through the gates and to the show facility. This is strictly enforced. Exhibitor Passes are good for 5 days of the fair.
31. **BREEDER SWEEPSTAKES CLASSES** are designated by a \$\$ behind the name of the class. These are point classes for the new Breeders Sweepstakes points program. ANYONE CAN ENTER THESE CLASSES. Points enrollments must be made prior to the event in which the horse will compete for prize money. All Points enrollments must be made directly to the AHA office, show secretaries may not accept these enrollments. Only sweepstakes horses with a paid up enrollment, **prior to the start of the show**, will earn points from these classes at this show.
32. **SHOW VETERINARIAN:** Sapulpa Veterinary Clinic will be the veterinarian on call 918-224-6867.
33. **PRIZE MONEY:** Will be paid out by the Tulsa State Fair within 30 days.
34. **SHOW OFFICE HOURS:** Show office will open Wednesday, September 29<sup>th</sup> at 1 PM. Show office will open Thursday, September 30<sup>th</sup> and Friday, October 1st at 7 AM. The show office will remain open throughout the show. It will close one hour after Thursday's session and one hour after the end of the show Friday.
35. **BREEDING/GELDING IN-HAND CLASSES** will use the In the Ring Class Procedure. You can view this procedure in the 2010 USEF Rule book AR107.
36. **CONCESSIONS** are available on the grounds.

**ACCIDENT PREPAREDNESS PLAN:** This show complies with article Gr1213 of the Usef rules. A Tulsa, Ok emergency medical services ambulance will be on the show grounds and available 24 hours during the duration of the show. Show management will be in contact with and be able to summon immediately if necessary. EMS can also be summoned from any pay phone or cell phone by dialing "911" and giving location. Should an EMT or ambulance be needed, contact show manager Art Byrd, show office, or Show arena paddock manager, and medical assistance will be summoned. The show management will assist in directing emergency personnel to incident site and assist with any traffic control needed to allow emergency personnel to perform their job. The phone number for the Veterinarian on call (Sapulpa Vet Clinic 918-224-6867) will be posted throughout the show grounds or can be contacted by the show office or show manager, Art Byrd.

**Motorized Vehicle Statement**

In accordance with GR1301.7:

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

### **2010 AHA Medal Class Specifications**

#### **AHA Saddle Seat Medal class.**

1) In addition to the rail work, all contestants are required to perform two or more individual tests from USEF Tests 1-15 or EC equivalent. Markers shall not be used.

#### **AHA Reining Seat Medal class.**

1) All contestants are required to perform a Reining pattern as outlined in USEF Reining, or EC equivalent. (Res 25-06)

2) Dropping of bits is optional with the judge but if called for in the ring, assistance, if necessary, may be had from one of the ring officials.

3) Reins shall not be removed from the horse's neck while inspecting bits.

4) In an AHA Reining Seat Medal class an off pattern rider is eliminated and is not eligible to win a medal or ribbon.

5) The prescribed AHA Reining Seat Equitation Score Sheet must be used and posted in accordance with USEF rule AR199.5. (Res.25-06)

6) For Exhibitor Number information, refer to USEF rule EQ103.6. (Res. 8/07)

#### **AHA Hunter Seat Not to Jump Medal class.**

1) In addition to the rail work, all contestants are required to perform two or more individual tests from USEF AR217 1-4 & sub chapter 2 (EQ113).

#### **AHA Western Horsemanship Medal class.**

1) In addition to the rail work, all contestants are required to perform a minimum of four tests from USEF AR224. (BOD 5/06)

**SPORT HORSE IN HAND EXHIBITORS:** Times will be assigned. In-hand classes will run in the order they are listed in the book. Let us know of potential conflicts when you send your entries in. We will do our best to assign a time to help avoid the conflict. We will work you in later in the day if you miss your time. You may also switch times with another person if you have a conflict with your time. Please let the paddock person know if you switch times with somebody.

**\*\*NEW\*\* GCAHA STALLION SERVICE AUCTION SPORT HORSE JACKPOT:** Any 2 and under horse sired by a stallion that participated in the GCAHA Stallion Service are eligible for these buy-in classes. **USEF MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS:**

**Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.**

**FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT**

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition.

I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules.

I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable-casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation.

The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

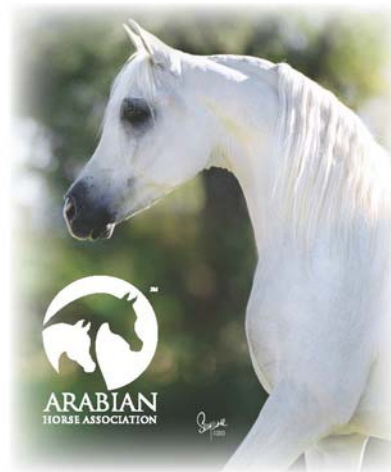
