MEETING MINUTES - JUNE

Board Meeting Minutes, June 25th, 6:00pm

Call to order

May Minutes approved

- Board discussed May show conflict with the Mayfest Show. In 2012 and 2013, the month of May will only have 4 Saturdays per month rather than the usual 5, subsequently the GCAHA show will be moved to the first weekend of the month to relieve the conflict.

- Trailer insurance needs were discussed. The trailer has been carried on Carolyn Lackey's policy but it needs to be moved to the GCAHA policy. Members discussed finding discounts from AHA and the replacement costs of the trailer and obstacles in the event of a claim.

Art Byrd read the minutes from the Region 9 Delegates meeting. Key point concerned the Region showing a negative income of -\$41,921.20. This does not take into account the profits from the Region 9 show. Also noted was Region 9 move to an entirely electronic newsletter produced 4 times per year by Constant Contact. Region 9 elections were held and results will be listed elsewhere in current GCAHA newsletter.

With no further business to discuss, meeting adjourned. General meeting followed.

General Meeting Minutes, June 25th, 6:30pm

As our speaker, Stan Morey, had a considerable drive time home, he spoke before the general meeting. Stan gave a very informative talk about his role in the Judges & Stewards Commission. The Judges & Stewards Commission holds seminars and schools for judges and for exhibitors to have a taste of what the view is from the center of the ring. He noted the importance of judging a horse back to front, bottom to top, and just how difficult the judge's job can be when judging numerous horses in a short span of time. He also advised the process of what to do should an exhibitor have an issue with a particular judge.

- Call to order.
- Previous month's minutes approved as recorded.
- Previous month's financials approved as recorded.
- GCAHA May show moved to 1st weekend of the month announced as well as the reasoning behind it. There is another show within the 250 mile boundary the same weekend so we do need USEF approval. Dressage show will also be held the first weekend in May.
- Art Byrd read the minutes from the Region 9 delegates meeting. Key points are laid out in the Board meeting minutes. Next delegate meeting is in September, one week before the Dallas State Fair.
- Velma advised the financials from the 2011 May Show. The show did make a profit of approximately \$2400.00. The trend is down with 15% fewer horses participating.
- Art requested that everyone attend the dinner provided in 2012. Since the 2011 dinner did not have enough diners to for the meals to be provided to the club, it ended up costing GCAHA \$150.00 The meal was catered by the fairgrounds which is not the same provider as the snack vendors.
- The competitive trail ride held in May was not without its challenges. Initially 35 riders signed up to compete. With the concern over the EHV-1 outbreak, many riders elected to keep their horses home. This dropped entries down to 25. Tornadoes in surrounding areas 1 week before the ride caused a loss of 3 more. In the end, 22 riders began the race, while one horse was pulled by the owner due to a snake bite. In all, the ride still made a profit of approximately \$90.00.
- Tammy Pickens gave an update on the spring Fun Shows. She noted that numbers are down. Still, she reported a profit of \$11.34. She noted GCAHA Youth needs trainers for the T.A.L.L.S. Program.
- The stallion service auction has a new coordinator. Jeff Wright has stepped in and noted he is looking for good committee members. He would like to see our stallions in the national forum.
- Finally, Art advised of Eddie Ralston's situation, the severity of the injury, and the medical expenses involved. Without health insurance, these medical expenses and loss of income during rehabilitation could be catastrophic. Art made the recommendation the club help out with expenses. Motion was made by Kathy Hart to move the \$500 planned donation for rescue instead to the Horseman's Distress Fund, earmarked for Eddie. It is tax deductable and 100% of the money will be provided to Eddie. Initially a \$250.00 donation was suggested from GCAHA Youth Fund for a total of \$750.00, however, Michelle Schrimshaw made the recommendation to up the general donation to \$750.00 for an even \$1000.00 donation. She advised the general fund does have over \$25,000 in the account. Motion carried.

Armed with the news of a healthy bank account, Beverly Cargile made the suggestion the club provide roast beef for the next meeting.

With no further business to discuss, meeting adjourned.

The meeting was called to order at 6:50 PM by Betsy. The first topic was election of delegates. Only 3 people had been nominated: Art Byrd, Kathie Hart, Velma Boodt. No other people were nominated. Art will secure insurance on the trailer and submit a statement of cost for reimbursement.

Kris Davis suggested a Trail Ride and Fun Show where all proceeds go to the Ralston Family. There will be a concession as well. It can be held at Eddies. She will organize and call on volunteers as needed.

Turnout- Draft (single and multiple) Turnout -Horse (single and multiple)</p> <p>Turnout- Pony and VSE (single and multiple, this will be split if entries war-</p>	<p>rant)</p> <p>Working-Draft (single and multiple) Working-Horse (single and multiple) Working Pony and VSE (single and multiple, will be split if entries warrant) After the ring classes participants will start on a short "continuous drive".</p> <p>The continuous drive will consist of 3 parts all done consecutively. Divisions will be Draft, Horse, Pony, VSE <u>First</u>, go to the arena and drive the <u>ADT Training level dressage test</u> (copies will be available at the show and they can be found at the ADS and <u>OHHA web site</u>). Use the whole arena; letters A,B,E,C will be available on the arena walls for your landmarks to drive the test. The judge will be sitting at the south end at C, and the entry gate will be beside the letter A, at the north end of the arena. You will enter the arena and drive the rail, the judge will blow a whistle and you will</p>	<p>start your test from inside the arena at letter A. We will start with the drafts, next horses, followed by ponies, then VSE. <u>Second</u>...after finishing the dressage test proceed to the cones course located north of the arena parking lot. The cones will be comprised of 10-15 sets of numbered cones, placed a generous width apart and they will not be changed between competitors. You will drive the cones after checking in with the timer/judge of cones. Cones will be judged as a pleasure scurry.... least faults (knock downs and balls down) and fastest time places highest. Canterng will NOT be allowed in the cones (see ADS-pleasure driving rules). <u>Third</u>...proceed from cones to the start gate for a short pace. The pace is a very short drive across the meadow and around the trees located just north of the cones course. The pace MAY consist of road traffic signs to be driven as you would on a public road, a U or a L obstacle and one or two obstacles in the grove of trees.</p>	<p>The tree obstacles will have no more than 3 gates (A,B,C) driven in correct sequence with the red letter on the right as you drive through the gate. No cantering is allowed on ANY part of the pace. The pace will be judged on correct driving of each obstacle, correct adherence to any traffic signs, and coming in at the most "ideal" time (not fastest) for your division. Ideal times will be predetermined by management and not be known to the competitor. Time will be based on ADS guidelines per equine size (horse,pony,VSE) and conditions such as weather and terrain. Last... YOU ARE DONE! Proceed to your stall, untack, relax, laugh, eat, drink and wait to pick up your award! The entire show should be completed by around noon. Wait times should be next to nothing. High Point awards and reserve for each division will be awarded. All classes will count toward high point.</p>
