GCAHA Board Meeting Minutes: March 15, 2008

Candy Wilhelm presented information she obtained on trailers. The club is looking for a 14 foot preferably enclosed trailer. Candy was given a quote of approx. \$4,000.00 for a enclosed, bumper pull, 14'X6', dual axle, no center post or divider through Ponderosa. Sundowner, U-Haul and Wagoner are other possible vendors on Candy's list. The club could sell advertising on the sides of a trailer for anyone donating toward its purchase. Art Byrd mentioned that we might call Home Depot on any trailers they might have. Velma Boodt mentioned she would check in her area and on HWY 66; Vicky Carnahan and Caroline Lackey will do the same.

Art presented Scotty Wainscott's 2008 calendar for the Tulsa Fair Grounds. The events are weekly between now and Nationals. Art also told the board members that Scotty mentioned the need for a new banner. Facts were presented to board members and will be voted on at the general meeting.

Vicky Carnahan and Becky Amason will work out a name tag list and process with plastic name tag covers and name tags as well as club logos and ribbons. (This same process may be worked out for the OAHC members who volunteer with us at Nationals.)

The GCAHA Board voted to have a stall available to club members at the Nationals Show. The stall would cost \$150.00 for the entire show and would be available to all members as well as visitors to the show. We will put our club banner across the front of the stall. Vicky Carnahan will check with Debbie Fuentes on the location and purchase of the stall.

Art Byrd explained the work needed for the National Trail Course materials for which our club is responsible. Art has acquired the materials for the bridge and flower boxes as well as the jump cups. Still needed are the following: 4X4 poles of 8', 10', and 12' lengths, 1X6's for 8 wing standards and 4 jump standards along with other items including paint. We would continue this discussion at the general meeting.

Becky Amason has visited with Kathy Wright. Kathy will make the championship pieces for the May show. They will be foals since it is spring instead of the adult horse head ornaments we had at the fall show. The club will be giving mugs for first place in regular classes.

The GCAHA will be giving away two rooms at local hotels to participants at the show. A number will be assigned to all entrants who enroll by the deadline of April 25th. Two numbers will be drawn and Sandra Byrd will inform the winners so that they can cancel any other reservations in time. GCAHA will be giving rooms at the Microtel, which is on the Fair Grounds.

Art Byrd brought up the issue of radios. Becky Amason proposed that we have Art purchase at least five (5) of the type of radio we need. Her motion was seconded by Barb McCalip and those present voted unanimously in favor of the purchase setting a \$500.00 limit on that purchase.

Art Byrd also asked for volunteer help for the Indian Territory Competitive Trail at the John Zinc Ranch this May. Due to the ice storm and the fact that we are the only group which the Zinc Ranch allows to use the facilities, there is MUCH CLEANING TO DO!!! We will have work days in April on the first weekend both Saturday and Sunday. We need chain saws and four wheelers to trim and drag or remove limbs from the trail. Insurance was already purchased for the ride but we are having to purchase more due to the extra time necessary for work days. At the ride we will need an ambulance trailer and driver for any possible horse problem, safety riders two to four to follow each group, weighers for the riders on Friday on arrival, and 'P and R' people who will need to go out on the trail by approx. 7:00 AM.

GCAHA General Meeting for March 15th, 2008

The meeting opened at 7:00PM and began with introductions. Those present were as follows: Velma Boodt, Rhonda Monson, David Sawyer, June Yahola, Vicky Carnahan, Becky Amason, Candy Wilhelm, Barb McCalip, Christina Dacewitz, Arthur Byrd, Desira Byrd, Frances Loyd, Ann Morrison, Sandra Byrd, Chet Byrd, Virgil Gremore, Linda Gremore, Lemuel and Harolynne Lemay, Nannir Marshall, Lea Wainscott, Scotty Wainscott, and Caroline Lackey. The minutes were passed as read in the newsletter with Barb McCalip proposing and Velma Boodt seconding. Becky Amason gave the Treasurers Report as follows: \$14,208.41 in the general account, \$5,362.00 currently in the Stallion Auction with over \$2,500.00 due in that account, and Sandra Byrd has approx. \$3,000.00 in the show account. Vicky Carnahan announced that the Buy-in Futurity has 26 purchases so

far for the 2008 weanlings. Open discussion proceeded on the topic of combining classes, which was researched by Michelle Schrimshaw and USEF will not allow. Further discussion will take place on the issue of making the stallion auction and buy-in futurities one big futurity so that owners would enter through the auction or the buy-in not both. This would mean babies will only be in one futurity and one open class.

She has also updated her information daily and does daily maintenance on the site something a non interested party would never do and we could not afford to pay them to do. He taught her what to look for in a horse and basic form to function rules to follow. Coming from a working cowboy family background, her grandfather, Abel Rodriguez, worked on the Gage Ranch in Marathon, Texas. Her grandfather Abel Rodriguez passed away peacefully on September 20th at the age of 103 years old, he will remain in our memories.

Arabian Horse Association Sweepstakes Program Pays 2.2 Million

The Arabian Horse Association (AHA) recently paid almost 5,000 of its members 2.2 million dollars in prize money earned during 2007. The largest payout came from the Allocated Payout Program which paid \$995,836, followed by the Points Payout Program that paid \$971,256. Other payouts included categories from the Breeders Incentive Program like the Nominated Sire Payout that paid \$74,572, the Allocated Nominated Sire Payout, which paid \$42,664 and the Breeder Nominator Payout that paid \$164,764. Broken down, each point earned by members enrolled in the points program paid them \$21.20.

AHA prize money programs are cornerstone programs meant to ensure the investment of breeding quality Arabians, Half-Arabians and Anglo-Arabians for years to come. In 2006 the program was enhanced to include Sweepstakes designated classes at most levels of AHA recognized competitions so that members showing at even their local AHA-approved event could earn points toward end-of-the-year payout as easily as top breeders and trainers who travel across the country for shows. As a result of program enhancements, the percent of horses participating in the Sweepstakes program is higher than ever before.

In addition, beginning in 2006 the Sweepstakes program added a payback category called Breeder Nominator, which guarantees that the person who nominates the foal in-utero as a Breeding Entry will earn 10 percent of the value of the points annually that the foal earns in Sweepstakes designated classes, for its entire life, whether the nominator owns it or not.

The 2007 top earner in a single category was Mister Maserati+ (Muscati x Na Bahjat), a reiner, who earned \$7,390.65 from the Allocated Payout Program. The Allocated Payout is paid to horses that earn Top Five or Top Ten honors in designated Sweepstakes classes at regional and national shows.

The Points Payout Program paid horse owners that hale from a variety of disciplines including halter, English, western, hunter, sport horse, reining and endurance. The Points Payout Program awards horses based on points earned in designated Sweepstakes classes at local, regional and national shows and rides throughout the calendar year as long as the annual enrollment payment of \$100 per horse is paid to continue participation.

If you show this program is worth the money. CT Carnahan has won over \$1,200 in 2007 and over \$1,500 in 2006. Better return for the \$100 than most lottery tickets. Check into it if your horse is Breeders Sweepstakes nominated.
